Clinton visits troops, POWs

The President of the United States, Bill Clinton, visited with troops and the former prisoners of war at Ramstein Air Base Wednesday on the last of a three base tour that included Spangdahlem and Rhein-Main Air

Bases to thank airmen and soldiers who are participating in ongoing Kosovo missions. Clinton was accompanied by Secretary of State Madeleine Albright, Secretary of Defense William Cohen, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Gen. Henry Shelton and a large congressional delegation.

President Clinton met with the

former POW's and their families for about 25 minutes at the base.

"Right now I'm just glad to have these people home — halfway home, anyway," the president said.

Clinton also took time to praise the families of the soldiers.

Ramstein medics fly former POWs

Three former U.S. Army prisoners of war passed through Ramstein Air Base Sunday on their way to nearby Landstuhl Regional Medical Center after 32 days of captivity in Belgrade, Yugoslavia.

Spc. Steven Gonzales and Staff Sergeants Christopher Stone and Andrew Ramirez flew to Ramstein from Zagreb, Croatia, in a 75th Airlift

Squadron C-9 airplane assisted by members of the 86th Aeromedical Evacuation Squadron who flew aboard the mission.

The three returning soldiers are assigned to the 1st Infantry Division in Germany.

The returning POWs disembarked to cheers from the assembled crowd of more than 200 soldiers, airmen and civilians.

Emotions ran high as the three soldiers lined up to salute Air Force and

Army officials. Onlookers waved American flags and held signs welcoming the trio back.

Some onlookers shouted and clapped, while others yelled "We missed you!" and "Welcome home!"

The three appeared a bit intimidated by the crowd at first, but quickly warmed up to the cheers and outpouring of feelings from the uniformed military members, spouses, children

As one of our C-9s brought our soldiers back from Zagreb, Croatia, our community responded exactly as expected — giving these troops a world-class welcome.

What a thrill it was to hear the cheers of our community and see hundreds of waving flags as we took part in this special event.

Just three days later, Ramstein Air Base would once again be in the world's spotlight as we were visited by our Commander in Chief, who was accompanied by our wing's entire Air Force warfighting chain of command — Secretary of Defense William Cohen, Army Gen. Wesley Clark, Supreme Allied Commander in Europe, Gen. John Jumper, U.S. Air Forces in Europe commander, and Maj. Gen. William Hinton, 3rd Air Force commander. All came to the KMC to be with us on this special occasion.

Our chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, Army Gen. Henry Shelton and the National Security Advisor, Sandy Berger, Secretary of State Madeleine Albright, and Ambassador John Kornblum among others also came to visit us.

Yesterday, we welcomed the NATO air chiefs as they arrived for a conference, including Gen. Michael Ryan, our Air Force chief of staff.

Well-known news personalities such as Jane Pauley, Wolf Blitzer, and Sam Donaldson, along with every major international news organization, have been on the base during the week — Tom Brokaw of NBC even hosted his Wednesday evening newscast from here.

All of this special attention comes on the heels of our heaviest flying schedule ever — more than 1,700 flying hours in the C-130 alone last month, surpassing the previous record of 1,400 hours during the height of mission in Bosnia.

And the mission continues at Ramstein without missing a beat. As all types of cargo come and go on the AMC ramp — our maintainers prepare our planes for another mission. Services lodging workers scramble to find more rooms for our hundreds of visitors — on and on and on.

Airman saves life of German child

An honor of a special type was given to a KMC servicemember April 28 in the city hall of Kaiserslautern.

Lord Mayor Gerhard Piontek held a reception and award ceremony for Senior Airman David Maradiaga, 86th Transportation Squadron, who saved the life of a 10-year-old German boy in March 1998.

The little boy, Florian, was eating dinner in a pizza restaurant with his mother, Jutta Haase, when suddenly he started choking. The mother reached over the table trying to help her son — without success — and started screaming for help and an ambulance.

Maradiaga, who sat in the booth right next to the boy, got alerted by the screams, turned around and reached for Florian. Instinctively he did the Heimlich maneuver, which he was taught in a first aid class. Florian screamed, spat and then recovered.

"These are seconds in a life, nobody ever wants to go through," said Haase. "I'm glad, Senior Airman Maradiaga took over the responsibility."

"I saw what happened, reached over, picked the boy up and did the Heimlich. There was no time to think about what to do, I just did it," said Maradiaga.

The senior airman became a lifesaver just one month after he and his wife Anne arrived in Germany. The young couple decided to go to that spe-

cific pizza restaurant that night, because they knew people speak English there and they have not learned any German yet. After getting lost on their way to the restaurant, they arrived just in time to help the boy.

"I'm very proud of Senior Airman Maradiaga," said Lt. Col. Becky Rowland, commander 86th Transportation Squadron. "We presented him an achievement medal last week to honor his outstanding behavior."

Kaiserslautern's lord mayor said that people of today's society have the tendency to look away, if something happens, but Maradiaga did not look away. He took control of the situation and saved the child's life.

"He was like an angel descending from heaven," said Piontek. "I'm happy to be able to honor one of our American friends today."

The lord mayor emphasized the fact that Germans and Americans have a very good relationship and cooperate well in the KMC.

Piontek presented Maradiaga a unique clock, which only is given by the city of Kaiserslautern, and a booklet with pictures of Kaiserslautern. Florian received a pen. The boy in turn thanked Maradiaga for saving his life.

"I'm glad he was there, I might not have survived without him," said Florian.

Florian's mother took a first aid class as a result of the incident. Florian also said that he would like to take a first aid class so that he is able to help other people in trouble.

TAACOM designated as theater support command

The 21st Theater Army Area Command became the 21st Theater Support Command (Provisional) April 30, during the monthly command retreat ceremony on Panzer Kaserne.

This is the first step in modernizing the command and control capability of the TAACOM from a post Cold War headquarters to a Force XXI headquarters.

The new headquarters will be structured to improve command and control of its units by effectively deploying the right amount of modular support using minimum assets. The command will be better able to accept and manage additional combat service support assets such as engineers, personnel, finance, transportation and medical units if directed by the Army service component commander.

The TSC will be a major subordinate command of the ASCC in a theater of operations. It will be a multi-functional command capable of providing command and control

of all combat service support functions under a single commander when directed by the Army service component commander.

Plans also call for a significantly increased capability for performing contingency contracting and coordinating host nation support.

The 21st TSC will initially be provisional, a temporary designation, which should become permanent in October 2000. This provisional period allows the unit time to readjust staff and staff functions to prepare for operations as a TSC.

"I think we will see the future of the TSC to be one that provides the capability to this theater and to the Army at large, that says—when called upon to deploy any large, or any sizable force, we will have the techniques, tactics and procedures already in place that will allow us to function very well early on in our deployment," concluded Army Maj. Gen. Charles S. Mahan, Jr., 21st TAACOM commander. (21st TAACOM Public Affairs)

Comm activates airways over Tirana

Members of the 1st Combat Communication Squadron from Ramstein Air Base arrived in Tirana, Albania recently to beef up connectivity for deployed troops supporting Joint Task Force Shining Hope.

About 100 members of the often deployed unit were sent to establish communications for base operations supporting international efforts to feed, clothe and shelter more than 300,000 ethnic Albanians displaced by civil strife in Kosovo.

Despite the obstacles associated with a bare base location, the team was able to provide "the integral communications link" in a matter of hours, said Master Sgt. Ray Riker, 1st CCS site superintendent in Tirana.

Heavy rain is one obstacle Riker's people had to overcome.

"Keeping the satellite phones, computers and radio systems operational under these conditions is a challenge," Riker said, "especially when

you have two inches of water over four inches of mud all around you. "But the area is much drier now, and rain or shine, our (customers) are extremely happy."

The superintendent of air traffic control operations, 2nd Lt. Robert Poulin, agreed.

"Morale is high," he said. "Initial communications were in place within six hours. With the approach radar certified, we're moving aircraft in and out of Tirana on a regular basis."

The local airport, Rinas, usually gets a handful of aircraft a day, but since humanitarian operations began, Poulin's controllers are handling between 200 and 300 aircraft movements a day.

"Our 20-plus controllers are working 12-hour shifts to make the skies over Tirana a safe, efficient place to fly," he said.

Now that the essential communication needs are met, 1st CCS will work on luxuries like e-mail access for airmen, said Poulin, "but that's a little ways down the road yet."

415th individuals earn prestigious awards

A 415th Base Support Battalion civilian earned a trip to the White House, and two battalion soldiers will be inducted into one of the Army's most prestigious noncommissioned officer organizations.

Bob Ackley, 415th BSB chief of utilities, energy and recycling, will travel to Washington soon to accept one of the White House Closing the Circle Awards from Vice President Al Gore. The award will be presented to Ackley for establishing the battalion's recycling program.

The program was judged as one of the waste reduction and recycling programs that has a significant impact on the environment.

"The credit goes to our 12 installation coordinators who execute the program within their installations on a daily basis. They've made (the program) the success it is," he said.

For Army Staff Sgt. Raymond Parcher and Army

Sgt. Ty Bruenderman, passing the Army's Sgt. Morales board April 21 meant joining an elite group of NCOs. The two will be formally inducted into the Sgt. Morales Club May 24 in a ceremony at 7th Army Training Command in Grafenwöhr, Germany.

The Sergeant Morales organization recognizes NCOs who exemplify leadership characterized by personal concern for the needs, training, development and welfare of soldiers.

Parcher, nabbed the 415th NCO of the Quarter and 26th Area Support Group NCO of the Year awards before his Sgt. Morales induction.

The assistant operations sergeant with the 415th BSB Provost Marshal's Office made good on a goal he established as a specialist. "It is a terrific feeling to have accomplished such a meaningful and worthwhile goal," said Parcher, a 28-year-old Saint Charles, Mich., native.

"Sgt. Morales is all about taking care of soldiers and their families. Everyday, I concentrate my efforts on helping my soldiers solve their problems and accomplish their goals. It is a great feeling when

you know you have made a difference in one of your soldier's lives."

Bruenderman's, the BSB commander's former driver and administrative assistant, path to induction began with his selection as the battalion's NCO of the year. The 30-year-old Portland, Ore., native said six months of preparation and reading lots of regulations prepared him for the board.

"My overall knowledge and showing that I cared for my soldiers was my greatest asset," said Bruenderman who has since moved to Fort Stewart, Ga. "The induction is an honor, because there are such a small amount of NCOs. It also carries a responsibility to continue setting myself apart."

415th BSB Army Command Sgt. Maj. John Taylor, who mentored the two soldiers, described them as two of the best he has seen in his 26-year career.

"First, this was quite an accomplishment for the battalion," said Taylor. "Of seven soldiers who appeared before the board, only three made it. Two of those were from our battalion. That says volumes for the quality of soldiers we have."

"They were vigorous advocates for their loved ones ... I was very moved by them," he said.

Following his visit with the released soldiers, the president and his motorcade headed to visit the headquarters of Joint Task Force Shining Hope, about 10 minutes away.

Upon arrival, he was briefed by Maj. Gen. William Hinton, JTF Shining Hope commander, on the operation that has delivered humanitarian goods to refugees in Albania.

The president was also shown the types of supplies that were sent down on C-130s and C-17s.

Following the briefing, cameras started flashing as the president shook hands with close to 150 people dedicated to supporting that humanitarian operation.

After spending more than an hour there, the president and his entourage

headed back to Ramstein to eat dinner in one of the aircraft maintenance hangers with approximately 300 troops who had supported Shining Hope and other operations in support of the Kosovo contingency.

As the airmen and soldiers ate hamburgers and barbecued chicken, the president greeted and thanked them for the job that they have been doing for their country.

"The United States military, because of people like you, can do things for a troubled world that no one else can do," he said.

"You're taking those supplies in to the refugees in Macedonia and Albania, you must have talked to some of them, you must know what they have been through," added Clinton.

"The humanitarian aid that you are taking to those desperate people is profoundly important," he continued.

"They are good people. They have their dignity. You are enabling them to keep what they can even though most of them were run out of their country with nothing but the clothes on their back."

He also spoke briefly about the sacrifices made by those military members participating in current operations.

"I just want you to know that the people back home know what you are going through," he said. "They do know what a sacrifice it is."

At the dinner, airmen had a chance to discuss issues such as the Middle East peace process, the situation in Iraq, the long term prospects in Kosovo and pay raises.

"The best part of being here and eating with the president was being able to listen to his views on the plight of the Kosovar people and understand-

ing his compassion towards that," said Capt. Jeff Alders, U.S. Air Forces in Europe Air Operations Squadron. "As well as gaining confidence that his conviction is heartfelt; and I believe it is."

"It was a really great and interesting experience," said Staff Sgt. Michael Eichler, USAF AOS. "I've never sat and ate with a president before. He's a very knowledgeable individual and I have a lot of respect for that."

"Nothing can ever compensate or take the place of the profound sense of satisfaction that you must get when you go to bed at night knowing that you did something that was good and decent," Clinton concluded. "Not because your country wanted to dominate another people or control land, but because we want all of our children to live in a decent land."

and others assembled.

One onlooker said immediately before the arrival that she cried when she heard the Americans were going to be released, her obvious happiness contrasted by the tears welling in her eyes.

The three quickly were whisked away for medical evaluation at LRMC via two UH-60 helicopters.

According to Rev. Jesse Jackson, the delegation leader to free the POWs, the efforts were part of a "mission of mercy — mission of faith."

For one C-9 crewmember, the flight was "the best thing I've done in the Air Force," according to Maj. Dave Stewart, 75th AS mission commander. Stewart flew tanker missions in Desert Storm, but he said those missions didn't even compare. "As an aircrew member, you think about being stuck behind enemy lines. You'd want somebody to come

and get you as soon as possible. We were the right plane and the right people for the job."

"It was awesome to be part of this once-in-a-lifetime event," said Staff Sgt. Alan Wooldridge, a medical technician who was on the aeromedical evacuation crew.

One thing that was a bit different about this particular mission was that the medical crew did not know the condition of the soldiers.

"So we hoped for the best, but prepared for the worst," said Wooldridge. Preparation included setting up emergency medical equipment in the special care area in case it was needed, added Wooldridge.

"In addition to checking their medical condition, we wanted to make sure they were comfortable," according to Capt. Ruth Kawano, 86th AES flight nurse.

"I had a tremendous, wonderful feeling when they came on to the plane," said Kawano. "I hugged each one of them as they came on."

Other crewmembers from the 75th AS included Capt. Chris McCarthy, copilot; Capt. Eric Berggren, copilot; Staff Sgt. Ben Niese, flight mechanic; Staff Sgt. Steven Fuentes, crew chief; and Airman 1st Class Joshua Westfall, crew chief.

Other medical personnel on the flight included Maj. Brian Hayes, flight surgeon, Capt. Keith Donaldson, aeromedical evacuation flight nurse; Senior Airman Matthew Wiese, aeromedical evacuation technician; Staff Sgt. Jane Brooks, aeromedical evacuation technician; and Staff Sgt. Bryan Gonyou, aeromedical evacuation technician.

Captains John Brewer and Todd Brace planned the mission and ensured the crew had the diplomatic clearances needed to fly the mission.



Airfield manager tops in Air Force

Ramstein's airfield manager was named the best airfield management senior NCO of the year for 1998.

Master Sgt. Gary Cardullo, chief of airfield management, learned he won the award on Apr. 22.

As Ramstein's airfield manager, Cardullo is responsible for ensuring a safe airfield environment for aircraft operations. This includes such tasks as

monitoring airfield construction, new building requests near the airfield, airfield pavement and markings, vehicle traffic on the airfield, aircraft parking plans, daily inspections and animal and vegetation control on the airfield, said Maj. Paul McLaughlin, Airfield Operations Flight commander.

"He takes extreme pride in the airfield and treats it like a child, constantly working to mold it into the best airlift airport," said McLaughlin.

McLaughlin also commended Cardullo for submitting a suggestion that was approved at U.S. Air

Forces in Europe level and is being considered at Air Force level to consolidate flight planning functions from each base into regional flight planning cells. The suggestion, he said, will save the Air Force millions of dollars in personnel costs due to reducing temporary duty requirements at locations like Moron, Spain and Fairford, England.

According to the award package, over 38,000 passengers and 130,000 tons of cargo were carried during 40,000 accident-free operations under Cardullo's airfield management in 1998.

President authorizes call-up of reservists

Up to 33,102 reserve component members can be called to active duty for Operation Allied Force under a presidential selected reserve call-up signed April 27 by President Clinton.

The call-up order authorizes the mobilization of reservists for up to 270 days. Initial focus is on 2,000 members and 47 aircraft in eight Air National Guard and Air Force Reserve air refueling units. The order affects all the services, however, and sets the Air Force activation ceiling at 25,000 reservists, the Army at 6,100, the Navy at 892, the Marines at 1,100 and

the Coast Guard, 10.

Charles Cragin, acting assistant secretary of defense for reserve affairs, said the units in the first increment are refuelers. The eight units are the Air Guard's 161st Air Refueling Wing of Phoenix, Ariz., 171st ARW of Pittsburgh, 117th ARW of Birmingham, Ala., and 128th ARW of Milwaukee, Wis.; and the Air Force Reserve's 927th ARW of Detroit, 940th ARW of Marysville, Calif., 434th ARW of Kokomo, Ind., and 931st Air Refueling Group of Wichita, Kan.

The reservists will help increase the tempo of the air campaign, Pentagon spokesman Ken Bacon said. They will be based in Budapest, Hungary.

Mail service available for deployed servicemembers

United States servicemembers supporting operations Shining Hope, Task Force Hawk, and Noble Anvil can now get mail thanks to new military post offices in Tirana, Albania, and Gioia Del Colle, Italy.

The service is strictly for personal and official mail directed at U.S. servicemembers in these locations and should not be used for shipping humanitarian relief supplies, according to U.S. Air Forces in Europe air postal officials.

B-52s arrive in Europe

The additional Air Force assets included eight B-52H's from the 2nd Bomb Wing, Barksdale Air Force Base, La.; two B-52H's from the 5th Bomb Wing, Minot AFB, N.D.; two E-3 Sentry Airborne Warning and Control System aircraft from the 552nd Air Control Wing, Tinker AFB, Okla.; and one EC-130 Airborne Battlefield Command and Control Center aircraft from the 355th Wing, Davis-Monthan AFB, Ariz.

The deployment fulfills in part an earlier request for more aircraft from Army Gen. Wesley K. Clark, commander in chief of U.S. European Command and supreme allied commander in Europe. The aircraft will support increased requirements for Operation Allied Force. (Air Force Print News)







Children honor their mothers Sunday

Every year on the second Sunday in May, mothers receive gifts or get pampered by their children. Throughout the world it is customary to celebrate Mother's Day.

Not many people know that this day has been initiated by just one woman. In 1907, exactly one year after her mother died, Anne Jarvis from Philadelphia had the idea to choose a day to thank mothers all over the world for all their love and unselfish care. The idea was put into practice one year later. Philadelphia became the first town to celebrate Mother's Day on May 10, 1908. Six years later, President Woodrow Wilson officially proclaimed the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day. In the following years Mother's Day became popular in India, China, Mexico, Scandinavia, England and Switzerland.

The first Mother's Day in Germany was celebrated in 1933. In



the initial years in Germany, mothers were not honored for their devoted work but were rewarded for the many children they had. In 1938, Adolf Hitler awarded mothers with the "mother's cross" to honor their outstanding help against low birth rates and death. Each year in August, on the birthday of Hitler's mother, he gave the bronze medal to mothers with four children, the silver medal to mothers with six and the gold medal to mothers with eight children.

After the war, it took a while before Germans started celebrating Mother's Day again. People still had terrible memories of the past, as well as the current miserable situation on their minds; they didn't feel like calling special attention to something that should be normal and taken for granted.

Today, Mother's Day belongs to the month of May. Children try to behave well and pamper their mothers that day — they prepare breakfast, give flowers or other

gifts. Despite the commercialism — gifts get bigger and more expensive — children should honor and take good care of their mothers every day, not only on Mother's Day.

As a counterpart to Mother's Day, men enjoy Father's Day, which in Germany is celebrated Thursday.

Actually Thursday is a religious holiday called "Christi Himmelfahrt," Ascension Day. The Bible says Jesus Christ's ascent into heaven took place on the 40th day after Easter, thus it's always on a Thursday.

German men celebrate Father's Day on Ascension Day on the analogy that Christ ascended to join his father in heaven that day.

Since the 19th century, it is customary for men, even if they are not fathers, to meet for walks, go on a bus tour, have barbecues or get together in a Gasthaus and have fun. Officially, Father's Day does not exist in Germany and is not listed on any calendar.



Castle fest features medieval arts, crafts

The German Castle Association, which will celebrate its 100th anniversary this year, will sponsor the traditional big medieval castle fest from Thursday through May 16 on Marksburg Castle near Braubach on the Rhine River.

One highlight of the well-known fest will be the medieval arts and crafts market, which will expand across the whole fest grounds. Several craft booths will present almost forgotten handicrafts such as a dyer, tanner, cellerman, knife maker, wheel wright and candle maker. The castle association insists on authenticity of the crafts and trades and the stands put up. Synthetic material is strictly forbidden. There will be no electricity and no modern machines. All participants will wear medieval clothes.

Throughout the market, jugglers will present their skills, minstrels will sing and knights will

compete in sword battles. Walpurga, the witch, will do mischief, court jesters will make people laugh and tightrope-walkers will present their acrobatic skills. Children can take part in a children's knights' tournament, listen to a fairy tale teller and ride a merry-go-round and giant wheel run by muscle power.

Spicy food and medieval drinks will be served in hand-made pottery.

The medieval market is open from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. each day, and Saturday until 10 p.m.

Parking is available in Braubach, which is located south of Koblenz. A bus shuttle will take visitors from the big parking lots near the Rhine River up to the castle. Visitors can also take a 15-minute walk from Braubach to Marksburg Castle.

Admission fee is DM 15 for adults, DM 8 for youths up to 18 years old and children shorter than two ells (ell is old British measurement; 1 ell is 2 feet) are admitted free. The family tickets cost DM 35.




