ACTION LINE

Red light special

Comment: I was wondering why the north gate light flashes red on the weekends and when the gate is closed. It should be a yellow flashing light. It was at one time. There is no reason I can see to keep it a red flashing light. It wastes gas from having to stop and start, not to mention wear and tear on tires and brakes.

Response: The traffic light at the North Gate is programmed to flash red for north bound traffic along Patrick Avenue and east bound traffic along North Perimeter Road between 6 p.m. and 6 a.m. on weekdays and throughout the weekend. During this same time period traffic entering the base and exiting the base along Patrick

Avenue is provided a flashing yellow light. Although the gate is normally closed during these hours, special events and guard weekends often cause the gate to be opened. The light is programmed to accommodate the need for traffic flow through this gate at any time. Reprogramming the light to further variations in traffic flow would add unnecessary costs to the service contract that maintains the timing of the light. Therefore the light has been programmed to accommodate as many traffic scenarios as possible. In addition, the red light reduces traffic speed at this intersection to enhance safety. However, an investigation by the Base Traffic Engineer is being conducted to reexamine the timing of the light to ensure that it is properly serving the needs of the base.

Milosevic frees U.S. soldiers from captivity

Rev. Jackson plays vital role in POW release

RAMSTEIN AIR BASE, Germany — Three former Army prisoners of war passed through Ramstein Air Base, Germany, May 2, on their way to nearby Landstuhl Regional Medical Center after 32 days of captivity in Belgrade, Yugoslavia.

Spc. Steven Gonzales and Staff Sergeants Christopher Stone and Andrew Ramirez flew to Ramstein from Zagreb, Croatia, in a 75th Airlift Squadron C-9 airplane assisted by members of the 86th Aeromedical Evacuation Squadron who flew aboard the mission.

The three soldiers are assigned to the 1st Infantry Division in Germany. The returning POWs arrived to cheers from the assembled crowd of more than 200 soldiers, airmen and civilians. Emotions ran high as the three soldiers lined up to salute Air Force and Army officials. Onlookers waved American flags and held signs welcoming the trio back.

Some onlookers shouted and clapped, while others yelled, "We missed you!" and "Welcome home!"

The three appeared a bit intimidated by the crowd at first, but quickly warmed up to the cheers and outpouring of feelings from the uniformed military members, spouses, children and others assembled.

One onlooker said immediately before the arrival that she cried when she heard the Americans were going to be released, her obvious happiness contrasted by the tears welling in her eyes.

The three quickly were whisked away for medical evaluation at LRMC via two UH-60 helicopters.

For one C-9 crewmember, the flight was "the best thing I've done in the Air Force," according to Maj. Dave Stewart, 75th AS mission commander. Stewart flew tanker missions in Desert Storm, but he said those missions didn't even compare. "As an aircrew member, you think about being stuck behind enemy lines. You'd want somebody to come and get you as soon as possible. We were the right plane and the right people for the job."

"It was awesome to be part of this once-in-a-lifetime event," said Staff Sgt. Alan Wooldridge, a medical technician who was on the aeromedical evacuation crew. One thing that was a bit different about this particular mission was that the medical crew did not know the condition of the soldiers. "So we hoped for the best, but prepared for the worst," said Wooldridge. Preparation included setting up emergency medical equipment in the special care area in case it was needed, added Wooldridge.

"In addition to checking their medical condition, we wanted to make sure they were comfortable," according to Capt. Ruth Kawano, 86th AES flight nurse.

"I had a tremendous, wonderful feeling when they came on to the plane," said Kawano. "I hugged each one of them as they came on."

Andrews honors Asian-Americans, Pacific Islanders

During the month of May, the Capital Flyer will run a series of articles that honor Asian-Americans and Pacific Islanders and their month.

May is a month of remembrance. Memorial day is a day when we stop and remember our loved ones who have passed on, but it's more than that. May is also the month we remember and appreciate the contributions made to our nation by Asian-Americans and Pacific Islanders. The theme this year for Asian-American/Pacific Islander Heritage Month is "Celebrating our Legacy." Consider the important contributions of Asian-American/Pacific Islanders and the virtues of life they demonstrated throughout WWII.

On Dec. 7, 1941, Japan bombed Pearl Harbor and the United States entered WWII. The War Department, suspicious of persons of Japanese descent, would not allow them to join or remain within the military. Japanese-Americans were ordered to report to relocation camps primarily located in remote and deserted places throughout the United States. Those who refused were placed in War

Relocation Authority prisons. Japanese-Americans were robbed of their dignity, forced to sell their property and leave their homes.

In 1943, as casualties of war increased, Japanese-Americans, living in relocation camps, became a solution to the War Department's need to replenish the fighting force. The War Department reversed its decision to exclude Japanese-Americans from serving in the military and even asked volunteers to join the war. Many Japanese-Americans were reluctant to join the military and asked themselves how anyone could ask them to volunteer and fight after what they and their families had been put through? Some looked beyond their country's actions and joined anyway. Their willingness to join stemmed from an extreme loyalty toward their home, the United States.

The volunteers formed the only two all Japanese-American units, the 100th Infantry Battalion and the 442nd Regimental Combat Team. These two units eventually combined and fought in seven major campaigns in Europe. They received 9,486 Purple Hearts and became known as the "Purple Heart Battalion." In addition to the Purple Hearts, their valor earned them 8,657 individual decorations, including one Congressional Medal of Honor. Some of these medals were received for their famous rescue of the "lost battalion." During a push into German occupied territories, a Texas battalion was cut off from the rest

of the advancing troops. Surrounded by German infantry, the 442nd was ordered to go in and liberate the Texan battalion from the enemy. For six days, they pressed on, suffering casualties until they reached and freed the trapped Texan battalion. Their success was not cheap: there were 2000 casualties, including 140 dead. As you can see, the love of country and loyalty are bonds that are hard to break.

Many Japanese-American veterans today don't look back on how their country treated them, instead they remember the reality of how terrible the war was and the need to do whatever they could to help end it.

Earlier, I expressed the most important contribution of Asian-American/Pacific Islanders to this country was the virtues of life demonstrated throughout WWII. Just in case you have not figured out what those virtues are, I am going to tell you. Forgiveness, they immediately forgave the very people who placed them in camps. Unselfishness and loyalty, they were willing to lose their own lives to save others in support of their comrades and country.

Just as Japanese-Americans did, we as people need to follow their example and look past how others may have treated us and give a 110 percent back to our fellow man or woman. Just as Japanese-Americans did in WWII.

Volunteers get ready to SHARE

SHARE, the Self Help And Resource Exchange, is a non-profit organization that rewards people for community service.

For as little as two hours of community service, volunteers can buy foods like steak, chicken, hamburger and turkey at nearly a 50 percent discount.

The program inspires people to build their communities, said Reggie Glenn, community developer for SHARE. Glenn works at the SHARE headquarters in Hyattsville.

"SHARE offers a great support for any community," said Glenn. "It uses food as the key ingredient to help build and support local community needs."

Volunteers complete service hour vouchers and pay \$14 for every two hours of volunteer work accomplished. Payments must be received the first week of every month. Food distributions for Andrews AFB are on the fourth Saturday of every month.

"Everyone that wants to participate this month, must pay a SHARE staff member today," said Tech. Sgt. Beverly Sargent, SHARE site coordinator. "The food will be delivered on base May 22. We'll let all volunteers know where to go to pick up their food." (A SHARE food distribution location had not been named by press time.)

This month's menu is turkey burgers, chicken breasts, beef hot dogs, smoked sausage, chicken wings, rice, pinto beans, potatoes, onions, cranberry-raisins, cranberry juice and four or five other grocery items. June's menu may include steaks, according to Sargent. "Just in time for barbecuing," she said.

It's important to remember that SHARE is a program

run by volunteers for volunteers. "The food is not government surplus or damaged goods," Glenn explained.

"There are no bent cans or past date or donated goods. We buy our staple items in bulk and ask for volunteers to come out and help us bag them for our customers."

"In other words," Sargent added, "if you don't have any idea of where you can volunteer, work for SHARE. We'll certify your hours, accept your money, then you can help bag your food and others' too."

AFOSI Washington Field Office activated

ANDREWS AIR FORCE BASE, Md. - The Air Force Office of Special Investigations activated a new 70-member field investigations squadron during ceremonies Monday. The squadron's mission is to address investigations and issues of high political concern in the National Capital region. The 33rd FIS, also known as the Washington Field Office, is located at Andrews, and consists of three subordinate detachments at Andrews, Bolling

The core of the new organization is a 50-person Tactical Operations Center, based at Andrews. The TOC is organized into four, multi-functional teams and includes all of the specialist functions previously assigned to Andrews, together with the counterintelligence agents previously assigned to the Bolling, Andrews and Fort Meade detachments.

The TOC's principal responsibilities include the con-

duct of all counterintelligence, force protection and protective service operations within the National Capital Region, specialized investigative support to AFOSI units, and a worldwide counterintelligence and terrorism surge capability.

New roles and missions of the squadron include national-level intrusion investigations, security for the secretary of the Air Force, and support to worldwide crises as directed by senior AFOSI leadership. Planned future missions include the addition of a surveillance team and surveillance detection team.



TRICARE expert answer Reserve question

Question: I am a reservist. Am I and my family eligible for TRICARE?

Answer: When Reservists are placed on active duty orders, they are authorized medical care in a military treatment facility the same as any other active duty member. While on active duty orders reservists have priority for care in military facilities, just as any other active duty member.

When reservists retire, they do not become eligible for TRICARE or Space-A care in a military facility until they reach

age 60.

TRICARE is not available to military beneficiaries over age 65. Family members of reservists may use military healthcare as follows:

When the sponsor is on active duty orders more than 30 days but less than 179 days;

May use military treatment facilities on a Space-A basis, or

May use TRICARE Standard & TRICARE Extra (formerly Champus) While the sponsor is on active duty orders for 179 days or more;

May enroll in TRICARE Prime or use TRICARE Standard/Extra and

May use military treatment facilities on a Space-A basis.

When the sponsor retires and reaches age 60:

May enroll in TRICARE Prime or use TRICARE Standard/Extra and

May use military treatment facilities on a Space-A basis.

TRICARE may not be the ideal choice for all families of long-term activated reserve personnel, but it does offer an additional option of health care coverage. For more information on TRICARE contact Sierra, the civilian contractor for this area at 1-888-999-5195.

On-base traffic accidents raise questions about safety

How to avoid mishaps on, off Andrews

Last year over 22 million Americans were involved in automobile accidents. According to the 1998 World Disaster Report, traffic accidents will become the third largest killer, behind clinical depression and heart disease.

Although there is a degree of safety and tranquility on base, several on-base accidents last week show that Andrews is not immune to hazards. Since the start of the year, there have been 15 minor and six major accidents reported. While these numbers are low and there have not been any traffic fatalities, our goal should be to reduce accidents to zero. Accidents don't just happen -- they are caused. Consider the following measures and help eliminate traffic accidents on and off base.

Our statistics show the majority of accidents occur in the parking lots of Malcolm Grow Medical Center, the Commissary and the Base Exchange. Here are some ways to avoid a "backing accident":

1) Before getting into a car, walk

around and look for hazards like telephone poles, shopping carts, protective poles, etc.

2) Estimate the distance between your car and other parked cars and check out traffic patterns

3) Back out slowly, and follow the 10-mph speed limit when entering and exiting parking lots.

4) Yield to other drivers who may be backing out at the same time.

5) Keep checking the mirror while backing, but don't rely on mirrors alone. Many mirrors are marked "Objects are closer than they appear to be."

6) If in a tight parking space, ask someone to guide you out.

Once safely out of the parking lot, prevent other accidents by following posted speed limit signs and paying attention to traffic. Remember, unless otherwise posted, the speed limit on the

installation is 25 mph. The speed limit is the maximum speed for good weather, good visibility and when there is no pedestrian traffic or other congestion. With any change to those conditions driving speeds should be reduced.

Don't become distracted while driving. We've all heard of the dangers of driving and using cell phones.

Workcenter radios aren't much different. A driver wrapped up in conversation can lose control of a vehicle. If involved in a long or complex transmission or conversation, do the prudent thing and pull over for everyone's safety. The same applies if something is dropped while driving. While it might seem easy to reach over and get it, accidents have occurred while drivers have attempted to pick up dropped objects.

Last, pay attention to traffic and drive defensively. Never assume what another driver will do, and anticipate their mistakes. For example, does a stop or yield sign mean the other driver will really stop or yield? Most of the time, they will. However, if it looks like they aren't slowing down, then drive defensively and stop until the other vehicle passes by. It may be inconvenient, but far less so than filling out accident forms or worse, a trip to the hospital.

Accidents don't just "happen." The truth is, we can prevent accidents if we put forth the effort to eliminate the cause. Again, I encourage drivers to think about these measures and help prevent accidents on our base.

Andrews thanks UTAs for job well-done this tax season

A dedicated group of volunteers made an extraordinary gift to the Andrews community this year, donating services worth more than \$100,000 to people on this installation.

This year 50 Unit Tax Advisors prepared 1,565 federal tax returns generating over \$1,650,000 in refunds. Their hard work saved the Andrews community \$112,404 in tax preparation fees. The UTAs embraced the Year of the Family and did all they could to help their fellow airman.

The UTAs worked as part of the base Tax Assistance Program. The UTAs received a week of training from the IRS, with special emphasis on tax issues unique to military members. UTAs prepared tax returns for service members in their units and also worked in the Central Tax Facility preparing returns for active duty members, dependents and retirees. In addition to providing help preparing tax returns, the UTAs filed tax returns electronically, at no cost.

Chief Master Sgt. Jan Pardalis summed up their motivation to volunteer for the program. "I enjoy helping our younger airman. This program helps save them money, and it gives me a great sense of satisfaction. It's

one of the few things I get to do where people are instantly appreciative. We make something that could be a nightmare for some people, a quick and painless experience."

"We would also like to thank the commanders and supervisors for allowing their troops to work in the tax center and help their fellow airman in the duty section, especially with the minimum manning some units are experiencing," said Capt. Life after death

OSI colonel pays tribute to late son through writing

People find many different ways to deal with the loss of a loved one. Some try to forget about it, while others totally blank it out of their minds. However, one AFOSI member deals with the grief through his new found passion in writing children's books.

Lt. Col. Chris Orndorff, chief of readiness, lost his son, Lionel, to meningitis at the age of four months in 1984. Since then, it has been a difficult time in Orndorff's life. "After about six months, I still felt as if Lionel had just died. I had to do something, so I started to tell stories to my other two boys, John and Michael, with Lionel in them," said Orndorff.

The colonel said the stories were a way for the family to spend time with Lionel. After telling the bedtime stories, Orndorff decided to put them on paper. "It's funny, because I would do everything possible to avoid writing when I was growing up," he said. "I would actually search out professors in college that didn't require a paper."

Orndorff said he felt compelled to write after graduating with his master's degree in humanities from Western Kentucky University. From this new inspiration to write, he produced his first book, "Prince Michael and the Dragon." In the book, the Tennessee native tries to include everyone in the family, including his children's friends.

The first book is about a royal family living in the make believe Land of El. It's up to Prince Michael (his middle son) to fight a ferocious dragon and save the kingdom, he said. "I didn't want to exclude Lionel just because he lived somewhere else (heaven). I included him in with his brothers and sister, Mary, so it felt like he was there with us."

With one book already published, the newly acclaimed author is in the process of completing two more children's books. My goal was to write a book highlighting all my children," he said. "My first one was on Michael and my other two are dedicated to Mary and John. Their titles are: Prince John's Quest, and Princess Mary and the Prophet."

The 24-year veteran is planning on retiring to Tennessee in June and is looking forward to expanding his writing to other areas of interest. With his children's books behind him, Orndorff is in the process of writing his latest novel about a preacher who becomes a drug enforcement agent.

The novel deals with many of Orndorff's own experiences as well as experiences of fellow agents. He also plans to write other books in the fields of management and religion.

It's tough holding a full-time job and trying to get published at the same time, he said. "Once I retire, I'll be able to devote more of my time to my novels and hopefully get them on the market a lot faster than my children's books," he said.







The Curators of our Nation's COLORS

Clean, crisp, sharp airmen stand at the position of attention. In a loud, clear voice, the bearer of the National Colors calls out a command and the airmen execute it with movements so precise and exact, they could easily cause surges of pride and even honor to pulse through the on-lookers' veins.

The airmen are some of 13 certified members, all volunteers, who have chosen to challenge themselves with an enormous responsibility -- representing not only the 89th Airlift Wing, but the entire Air Force and military members, past and present.

They are the Andrews Air Force Base Color Guard.

The color guard performs primarily on base for numerous ceremonies, such as change of commands,

retirements, weddings and award presentations.

How do they manage to perform these vast and difficult details with expertise that seems instinctive?

Through lots of time, hard work and good old-fashion practice, according to Senior Airman Nick K. Han, 789th Communications Squadron and coordinator for the color guard.

"There is about a two-month minimal training period before airmen are eligible to become certified as a ceremonial guardsman," said Han. "That may not seem like an appropriate amount of time, but we practice every Tuesday from 1-4 p.m., and once you learn it all, it becomes second nature to you."

The guardsmen are responsible for the various drill movements, weapon techniques and colors, or flag, presentations.

But the most vital responsibility is reliability, said Han.

"It is up to the individual himself to show up on time and know that he has a detail to do and be fully prepared ahead of time," he said. "You must be committed to do something and be there to do it."

Performing at an average of 40 to 50 ceremonies every three months, the color guard keeps busy and must always be ready to uphold their tradition of excellence, according to Airman 1st Class Ken Jeltema, 89th Transportation Squadron.

"We are serving the Air Force by performing in a manner that portrays

professionalism to the utmost," said Jeltema. "Loss of military bearing is not tolerated in any way, shape or form."

Being a member of the Andrews' color guard is a very rewarding experience, said Han.

"There are few things you feel honor and prestige while doing. The participants rely on you during the ceremonies. We either make or break their day," explains Han. "Once, a retiree cried when I handed him the flag because of the pride he felt. Things like that make you never forget and make you really proud of what you are doing. It totally rocked my world."

"I also feel being on the color guard is a position full of honor, said Jeltema. "It builds character and confidence to be on the team. We are in front of large groups of people who show you respect and look up to you because you are protecting what our country is all about -- the National Colors."




Air Force pitches in to help Oklahoma tornado victims

TINKER AIR FORCE BASE, Okla. — A tornado ripped through central Oklahoma Monday night, carving a mile-wide path of destruction that stretched 25 miles from Norman, Okla., north past Oklahoma City.

The twister, with winds clocked at more than 250 mph, flattened more than 1,000 homes, killed scores of people and left thousands homeless. For those in its path, it was devastating. After the tornado had passed, Tinker Air Force Base, Okla., opened its doors. Reservists from Air Force Reserve Command's 507th Air Refueling Wing and 513th

Air Control Group, along with their active-duty counterparts, hurriedly put together a makeshift hotel for hundreds of people left with nothing more than the clothes on their backs.

Immediately after the storm had passed, 507th ARW members took a KC-135 out of its hangar to make room for survivors. Dozens of trucks rolled up to the hangar doors, bringing with them the basics of survival.

In the hangar, volunteers began to set up food lines and more than 300 cots. Bus after bus rolled up to the hangar doors bringing more survivors of one of the worst tornado disasters in history. Their stunned faces were met with open arms and warm kindness.

"We're going to do everything we can to support this disaster," said Col. Mark Pillar, 507th ARW vice commander. "And that's still not going to be enough."

All across the base military members rushed to help throughout the evening hours. Search-and-rescue teams formed to search the rubble. Medical technicians reported to the base hospital, fitness center and 507th ARW hangar to provide care for those injured. At the 507th ARW hangar, a makeshift processing line was formed to register people's names so others could know their loved ones were still alive.

Standing at the perimeter of what once was Del City, Okla., just outside the base, twisted homes could be seen in the glare of portable military light-all units. Across the road, a thriving residential community were left of only splinters and rubble.

The tornado, which had earlier been headed directly for Tinker, swerved at the last minute, plowing through the heavily populated area. The twister skirted the perimeter of the base, then moved on northward through Midwest City, Okla., immediately north of the base, again destroying everything in its path. The fence that once separated the base from the community lay flattened on the ground from the tornado.

The survivors' stories were heart-wrenching. Most lost all their worldly possessions, but thanked God for sparing their families. Others said they were never so scared in their lives. There were also stories of courage.

"I saw the twister go past my home," said Senior Airman Scott Branscum of Moore, Okla. "It was only 150 yards away. The noise sounded like a jet engine revving up, only it just kept getting louder and louder. My wife and I had our children in the bathtub. Our home had some damage, but some of my neighbor's homes just aren't there now."

Rustic airport supports NATO effort

TIRANA, Albania — One month ago, the sleepy little Rinas airport didn't handle enough air traffic to gain much notice from even the shepherds and their flocks in the nearby fields. But the picturesque scene has changed dramatically since the arrival of Joint Task Force Shining Hope. The multinational effort is providing humanitarian relief to the thousands of ethnic Albanian refugees displaced by Yugoslavian military units in Kosovo.

Where the airport once launched a meager 15 flights a week, there are now approximately 300. Where there was once a ragged soccer field, there is now a bustling military tent city complete with a dining facility, hot showers and a field medical facility.

"On April 4 we moved into Rinas International Airport in Tirana. Within three hours we'd begun humanitarian aid operations," said Maj. Tom Dolney, Joint Task Force Shining Hope's public affairs officer. "We've moved more than 15 million pounds of cargo through here."

The brunt of the load has fallen on C-17 cargo planes from the 437th Airlift Wing out of Charleston Air Force Base, S.C., and C-130 Hercules cargo planes from the 86th Airlift Wing, Ramstein Air

Base, Germany. Ramstein is also serving as the main staging area for the humanitarian relief effort.

"This is in line with Ramstein's function as the hub of air mobility within Central Europe," said 1st Lt. Todd Fleming, from the 86th Airlift Wing Public Affairs Office. "The base also serves as a major deployment staging area for Army units in Europe."

Many of the Ramstein Air Force units have gone to around-the-clock operations in support of the increased workload.

"America has its diversity in the services, but in times of crisis we come together to work as a team," said Master Sgt. William Miller of the 86th Maintenance Squadron, one of the units at Ramstein to switch to a 24-hour schedule. "The guys are putting in the long hours. It's tough."

Long duty days are also the norm for airmen deployed here, but the burden of extra hours is lightened by feelings of compassion for the Kosovar refugees waiting at the end of the supply line.

"I know that things are hard and our people are working long hours, but I think it's worth it to help these people," said Staff Sgt. Benjamin R. Blackstone, an air transportation specialist with the 623rd Air Mobility Support Squadron.
